#### **PRINCIPAL**

I am pleased to present to the school and wider community the Dongara DHS 2021 School Report. 2021 was a challenging year for our school community with increased health and social measures implemented to minimise the COVID19 risk in Western Australia. However, at Dongara DHS we were able to continue a relatively uninterrupted teaching and learning program, with completion of carnivals, Open Night, year 12 Valedictory, Presentation Night, Presentation Assembly, and the Coote Cup. Many of our extra curricula activities went ahead such as year 6 Camp, Country Week, and the Outdoor Education Camp. Our staff were not able to access as much offsite professional learning as desired, instead we engaged in virtual sessions or session delivered by teacher experts from our school. A highlight for our school was being selected as one of three finalists in the WA Governor's 2021 STEM Awards in the category of Excellence in Secondary School Leadership.



Our students and staff continued to demonstrate their resilience and flexibility in during the pandemic. Our parents and friends of the school continued their support and trust in our staff and for this I am grateful. I acknowledge the wonderful efforts of our cleaning and grounds staff who worked so hard to ensure our learning spaces and playgrounds were kept clean and safe.

I thank the School Board and P&C for their unwavering support of our school. Both groups worked hard to promote our school in a positive way to the wider community. I congratulate our students for their efforts in 2021 and for choosing respect, achieving their best, and being responsible. This shows that our students are achieving with honour. #### SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Dongara District High School is a proud Independent Public School in the Mid-West Education Region.

We provide comprehensive academic programs and supplement these with a very high standard of delivery. We offer our students the opportunity to participate in extension programs using online learning through SIDE for years 11-12 and on-site delivery of PEAC in Geraldton for years 5-6. Year 6 students are provided with a comprehensive transition program in readiness for entering secondary school. We partner with UWA through the ASPIRE program which supports our academic year 9 and 11 students to identify university pathways.

Programs with a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) focus are features of our curriculum initiatives. We have partnerships with local business, industry and agencies (CSIRO). We operate a comprehensive on-site Vocational Education Program for years 9-12. Non ATAR year 11 and 12 students can enrol in Certificate II/PAIS either on-site through a Hospitality Cert II or at Central Regional TAFE. A school horticulture centre has been established for year K-12 and we are a Stephanie Alexander School Garden School. A small number of year 11 and 12 students are enrolled in a mixed mode delivery including studying through SIDE, enabling them to follow an ATAR pathway with additional support provided by our highly qualified and motivated secondary teachers.


Our students have access to state-of-the-art facilities including interactive whiteboards in every primary classroom and specialist facilities in the secondary school. At the end of 2012 we saw the completion of a \$30 million facilities upgrade. We have over 250 computers/iPads for student use.

We have a vibrant cultural program and have participated very successfully in The Rock Eisteddfod Challenge, Waikakiri Dance Competition, YOH Fest and Croc Festival. In 2021, Dongara DHS was one of three state-wide finalists in the WA Governor's STEM Awards for Excellence in Secondary STEM Leadership.

There is a high level of parent involvement in the school. Regular P&C meetings are made up of a core of enthusiastic and committed parents. A pro-active unincorporated School Board plays a vital role in the formulation of the school vision, goals, policies, and monitors the operation and outcomes of the School Business Plan.





The school has seen an increase in secondary enrolments and retention as a result of positive publicity regarding student and staff achievement as well as a focus on academic excellence and STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics).

Primary numbers have decreased due to small cohorts moving through the school. This may be due to transiency and/or economic climate. The school is in partnership with Day Care, Playgroup, and the Community Health nurse to ensure that all pre-Kindy enrolments are accounted for.

The school Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA) is 952 which places us on the 24<sup>th</sup> percentile of educational advantage.

Due to COVID19, attendance rates were impacted in 2021. Our Business Plan goal was for 90% attendance, and we achieved 81.75% compared to Like Schools 80.2% and WA Public Schools 83.1%. Our attendance rates were also impacted by family holidays and disengaged students. Strategies that the school used to improve student attendance were:

- Attendance Certificates to students with 100%, 90% and above attendance
- Attendance Certificates to Classrooms and Home Rooms with 90% or above attendance
- Electronic absentee forms for parents via Outreach and Connect
- Health and wellbeing checks by Classroom teachers and Home Room teachers via phone calls/emails
- Health and wellbeing phone calls from Principal and Deputy Principals
- Information about good attendance in Newsletters
- Home visits by the DDHS Attendance Officers
- Development of attendance plans with families
- Attendance Officers from Regional Office worked with families
- Participation Officers from Regional Office worked with disengaged Senior School students

Data analysis of our stable cohort showed that value was added (progress) to student results for our stable cohorts in all tests, with the exception of year 7 writing. More value (progress) was added to:


- Year 5 stable cohort in grammar and punctuation, reading, and spelling compared to like schools, WA public schools, and Australia
- Year 7 stable cohort in reading and spelling compared to like schools, WA public schools, and Australia
- Year 9 cohort in punctuation and grammar reading, writing, spelling, and numeracy

Lower than expected Year 7 data was impacted by students who had newly enrolled in the school between their year 5 and 7 NAPLAN testing. The school did not have sufficient time with these students to be able to add significant value.

# Year 12 outcomes including VET (Vocational Education and Training)

- WACE achievement 2021 63%. The stable cohort achieved well with the WACE impacted on by new enrolments. The stable cohort WACE achievement was 83%.
- Cert II Hospitality achievement 83%
- Certificate of Commendation from the Minister of Education and Training, and the Director General, Department of Education for improved WACE completion and Year 12 progress and achievement in 2021





The School Board reviewed the National School Opinion Survey (NSOS) and compared it with the 2020 data. They were, in general, pleased with the results noting an upward trend in many ratings. Behaviour continued to be a focus area for the students and the school undertook a smaller survey to gather additional information around student concerns. Some of the new data contradicted the NSOS, and we believe that semantics in the NSOS made an impact on student opinions. Behaviour and student wellbeing continues to be a focus area for the school, led by the PBS and Health/Wellbeing leadership groups.







# **School Income by Funding Source**
