SCHOOL VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS & CHARGES 2026 Year 9 & Year 10

Dear Parents/Carers

The Education Act 1999 requires schools to notify parents/carers of the schedule of Contributions and Charges for the following year. The Dongara District High School Board has endorsed our schedule of Contributions and Charges for 2026 in accordance with the Department of Education Contributions, Charges and Fees Manual, October 2017. This schedule is designed to provide you with information about anticipated costs that may occur throughout the coming school year and allow you time for forward planning of the likely outlays. The schedule is made up of the following four areas:

1. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS - \$235.00 (per Student – see page 2 for details)

These voluntary contributions represent an important revenue source and supplements school expenditure in the areas listed over the page. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of our learning programs will be maximised when all families contribute. The funds are used to provide additional support for teaching and learning programs and go towards the cost of consumables used by students. Payments can be made direct to the school or via EFT (after receiving the first statement of the year).

2. CHARGES FOR EXTRA COST OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES (see page 2 & 3 for details)

Students will engage in a variety of activities associated with educational programs for which charges will be incurred. The Schedule of Charges section is outlined over the page. We encourage parents to make contact with the Principal or Manager Corporate Services should “upfront” payment be difficult.

3. PERSONAL ITEMS (REQUIREMENTS) LIST (see Personal Items List)

All students require Personal Items for their 2026 year level. Students will need these items for personal use in order to complete the educational programs provided by this school. Most items are available locally; however items may be purchased from any stationery supplier of your choice.

4. P&C MEMBERSHIP - \$1.00; and P&C CONTRIBUTION - \$ 15.00 (per Family)

Dongara DHS P&C is a vital organisation that encourages the participation of all parents in a variety of fundraising activities. The School Board and P&C seek this contribution, and also encourage parents to be involved in fundraising ventures aimed at supplementing our quality learning programs and achieving annual targets for resources and grounds improvements.

5. LIBRARY FUND - \$8.00 (per Student)

This contribution assists in the resourcing of educational and reference books to assist students in their curriculum program. These books are selected according to the School needs and are specific to the curriculum program.

6. CHAPLAINCY FUND - \$ 8.00 (per Family)

The Chaplain’s role is to serve the School by encouraging, motivating and inspiring young people to be the best that they can, and to help them through issues that may threaten their potential. The School would appreciate if you could donate to the Chaplaincy as this will assist in maintaining this valuable service to the students.

2. **CHARGES FOR EXTRA COST OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES – Important Notes (please read carefully):**
 - Charges for Performances and Excursion will be requested at the time of the event. If personal circumstances result in payment difficulties, please contact the Principal or Manager Corporate Services to make alternative arrangements, or email dongara.dhs.accounts@education.wa.edu.au
 - The charges may vary from Year Level to Year Level depending on the nature and range of activities undertaken. The estimated costs indicated represent the **maximum** amounts that a parent/carer should anticipate being charged throughout the coming school year. Very few students, if any, participate in the full range of activities available.
 - The charges outlined above and below will enable students to achieve the relevant learning outcomes for each area. In The Arts, Home Economics and Design & Technology areas, students/parents may negotiate with staff to complete a project that incurs materials costs beyond what is covered by the allocation shown above. Where this occurs, additional charges may be applied.
 - Statements detailing the relevant contributions and charges will be issued at the beginning of Term 1. Reminder of Unpaid Billing Items will be issued each term thereafter, until paid in full. Any balance remaining will be carried over to the following year. When a Student transfer to another school, arrangements will be made to forward a pro-rata portion of their voluntary contributions and charges to their new school. Alternatively, a refund will be arranged.
 - As approved by the School Board, the table below summaries the anticipated **maximum** cost of activities for each Year Group. You will be advised and asked to make payment for the activity as it approaches:
 - ***Secondary Assistance Scheme Public Schools 2026 Eligibility Criteria:*** *If you hold a valid card, for a period of no less than 4 weeks and current between 2nd February to 2nd April 2026, Services Australia (Centrelink) Family Health Care Card (green), Pensioner Concession Card (red) or Department of Veteran Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (blue) you are eligible to make an application for the Secondary Assistance Scheme that provides for an Educational Program Allowance (\$235) and a Clothing Allowance (\$115). Students must be enrolled in Years 7 to 12 and studying a full-time secondary course. The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age. Applications close 2nd April 2026. Please contact the School Office for an application form.*
